

Praise to you, O God, who gives us courage to start again. You fasten righteousness around your waist and baptize with the Holy Spirit's fire.


Bless us as we mirror your mighty fire in these simple flames, and teach us to mirror your justice in the paths we prepare.

¹¹Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, ¹²waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? ¹³But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home.






GREAT THANKSGIVING

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:



Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.


Our Father, who art in heaven,


