Introduction

This is the night of salvation! At the Vigil of Easter, we gather around fire, word, water, bread, and wine, proclaiming

through story and song that ours is a God who continuously brings life out of death. On this night we experience again the heart of God's baptismal promise and the center of our faith: we are claimed and cleansed, renewed in the death and resurrection of Christ. We gather with all the saints of every time and place to celebrate the good news: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

SERVICE OF LIGHT

Part I

We gather outside, preferably on the sidewalk; the ministers stand at the brazier on the steps.

Greeting

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **And also with you.**

Beloved people of God, on this most holy night when our Savior Jesus Christ passed from death to life, we gather with the church throughout the world in vigil and prayer. This is the passover of Jesus Christ. Through light and the word, through

water and oil, bread and wine, we proclaim Christ's death and resurrection, share Christ's triumph over sin and death, and await Christ's coming again in glory.

Lighting the New Fire

The presiding minister waits until the fire is burning before praying:

Let us pray.

Eternal God, in Jesus Christ you have given the light of life to all the world. Bless this new fire, and increase in us a desire to shine forth with the brightness of Christ's rising, until we feast at the banquet of eternal light; through the Sun of righteousness, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Inscribing & Lighting of the Paschal Candle

The minister prepares the candle, a sign of the paschal mystery, the death and resurrection of Christ.

Now and forever. **Amen.** Year *Trace the fourth numeral at the lower right.*


The presiding minister lights the paschal candle and says:

The light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds. *The assisting minister lifts the candle so all may see it.*

Procession into the Church

The procession into the darkened church begins, led by the assisting minister bearing the paschal candle.

At the first landing of the stairwell, the assisting minister holds the candle, lifts it high, as the cantor sings:



Mid-way down the aisle, the assisting minister lifts the candle high and the cantor sings a second time:



At this point hand-held candles are lit and the procession continues. In order that all are safe, please only tilt the unlit candle as the light is passed. The lit candle remains upright.

At the chancel, the assisting minister turns to face the congregation, and, when all have reached their places, lifts the candle high and the cantor sings a third time:



The paschal candle is placed in its stand.

Easter Proclamation

Candles remain lit until the end of the Easter Proclamation The cantor begins the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet):

Prayer of the Day

Let us pray.

O God, you are the creator of the world, the liberator of your people, and the wisdom of the earth. By the resurrection of your Son free us from our fears, restore us in your image, and ignite us with your light, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**

The assembly is seated. Hand-held candles are extinguished.

WORD

Part II

Seven of the traditional twelve lessons regarding salvation history are read.

First Reading: Genesis 1:1—2:4a Creation

Silent reflection

Prayer: Almighty God, you wonderfully created the dignity of human nature and yet more wonderfully restored it. In your mercy, let us share the divine life of the one who came to share our humanity, your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Second Reading: Genesis 7:1-5, 11-18; 8:6-18; 9:8-13 *Flood*

Silent Reflection

Prayer: O God, strength of the powerless and light in all darkness: Look in mercy upon your church, a wonderful and sacred mystery, that it may be an ark of peace in the midst of chaos. Let the whole world come to see that what was fallen is being raised up, that what was old is being made new, and that all things are being restored to wholeness through the one from whom they first took being, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Fourth Reading: Exodus 14:10-31; 15:20-21 Deliverance at the Red Sea

Prayer: O God, whose wonderful deeds of old shine forth even to our own day: By the power of your mighty arm you once delivered your chosen people from slavery under Pharoah, a sign for us of the salvation offered to everyone by the water of baptism. Grant that all the peoples of earth may partake in the salvation of the Israelites and together dance on the safe side of the sea, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Fifth Reading: Isaiah 55:1-11 Salvation freely offered to all Silent Reflection

Prayer: Holy God, you created all things by the power of your Word, and you renew the whole earth by your Spirit. Give now the water of life to all who thirst for you, that, rejoicing in your covenant of mercy, we may bring forth abundant fruit, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Eighth Reading: Ezekiel 37:1-14 Valley of the dry bones Silent Reflection

Prayer: Living God, by the death and resurrection of your Son you have brought us out of sin into righteousness and out of death into life. Breathe into us your life-giving Spirit, that receiving the gifts of word and sacrament, we may live in the hope of all your blessings to come, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Tenth Reading: Jonah 1:1-2:1 *The deliverance of Jonah*

Silent Reflection

Prayer: O God of deliverance, you saved Jonah through the waters of death, and after three days you brought him to new life. Speak to us by this sign, and call us to repentance, that we may heed the voice of your risen Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Twelfth Reading: Daniel 3:1-29 *Deliverance from the fiery furnace*

Silent Reflection

Prayer: Almighty and eternal God, the only hope of the world, by the proclamation of your prophets you declare to us the word of salvation. By the grace of your Spirit increase the devotion of all the baptized, that, strengthened by your presence, we may withstand hardship and sorrow and be united with your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Canticle Benedicite – a Song of Creation

During the canticle the assisting minister takes the paschal candle and leads the procession to the baptistry.

The assembly lights their candles again and join the ministers in procession to the baptismal font.

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Dear Friends in Christ, let us ask God, the lover of humankind, to bless this font, that those reborn in it may forever be joined to the community we share in Christ. By your grace bless this womb of your church where your children are born again.

Blessing of the Font

Water is poured into the font.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give God thanks and praise.

It is indeed right that we give thanks to God who passes over us in a wonderful and unseen power. The power of God's touch rests in the gentleness of grace and the miracle of new life.

In baptism we use your gift of water, which from the beginning covered the earth with the energy of life.

It was at the very beginning of the world that your Spirit moved over the waters and gave water the power to sanctify new life.

By water you washed away the sinfulness of a world gone awry. By the waters of the flood you condemned the wicked and initiated virtue. Through water you led the children of Israel by a pillar of fire, out of their bondage in Egypt into the freedom of the promised land.

On this night Christ leads us through his death and resurrection from the bondage of sin into the freedom of the promised land.

May you look mercifully upon your church gathering here and assist us to let grace flow in torrents from this place so that our love may multiply your acts of renewal.

Open the fonts of baptism all over the world for the renewal of the nations, so that under your majestic dominion the Holy Spirit may flood the earth with healing and the grace of your only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, Our Lord.

Blessed be God forever!

The presider touches the water.

May this water be fruitful so that a heavenly child may come forth from the divine womb of this font.

May all be gathered into a new infancy by the motherhood of grace and may we all be renewed by these waters and affirmed in the promises revealed by God in Jesus Christ.

Because of your passage on this night through the waters from death to life, may all unclean spirits depart from here at your command; may all wickedness and satanic deceit be banished. May no power of the enemy remain here to fly about and lay traps, nor creep in by stealth and corrupt by its poison.

The presider touches the water.

May this element of water be free from all the enemy's assaults and cleansed by the removal of all it's wickedness.

May the word of Christ spoken in baptism free us from all assaults of the devil and may this font be our symbol of renewal.

May it be the font of life, a water of new birth, a stream of purification, may all who are washed in this bath of salvation, obtain, through the Holy Spirit working in them, communion with Christ.

Blessed be God forever.

The presider makes a cross above the water.

I bless you, O Water created by the Almighty, who in the beginning separated you from the dry land and lifted life out of your murky depths.

The presider sprinkles the water toward the four corners of the earth.

God made you flow from a fountain in paradise and asked you to water the whole earth;

God led us to this place, like an oasis in the desert, to quench our thirst and refresh us for the journey.

I bless you also as the sign given by our Lord Jesus Christ when by his power he changed you into wine at Cana in Galilee and when he walked upon your surface and when he was baptized in your Jordan stream by John.

Following the institution of Christ, we baptize believers and return ourselves, again and again, to the waters for healing and refreshment.

Blessed be God forever.

The presider moves the evergreen branch three times over the water and blows on the water.

May the breath of God breathe on us and may God's lips kiss these waters.

The Easter Candle, representing Christ as the pillar of fire, is lowered three times into the water.

Let the power of the Holy Spirit descend into the waters of this font and make the whole substance of the water fruitful for regeneration. And let us rise from these waters born of the Spirit to live a new life: to continue forever in the risen life of Jesus Christ.

Here may our sin be washed away, may human nature be recreated to the glory of its maker, may the word of forgiveness heal us from all pain and may everyone who receives this sacrament of regeneration be born again into a new infancy of true innocence.

Through the power of Christ rising from the dead, reborn in the Spirit, and the one who will come to judge the living and dead and all the world to come.

Amen.

Blessing of the Baptismal Oil

Dear Friends in Christ,

In the beginning, the Spirit of God hovered over the creation; and, throughout history, by the gift of the Holy Spirit, God's people have been empowered for service in and for the world. As a sign of that gift, the priests and kings of Israel were anointed with oil; and our Lord Jesus was anointed with the Holy Spirit at his baptism as the Christ, God's own Messiah.

At baptism, Christians are likewise anointed by that same Spirit to empower them for God's service. Therefore, let us now set apart and bless these oils to be signs of that anointing. With this perfumed oil may all who are baptized bear the fragrance of the Holy Spirit, and may all anointed experience the compassion and saving love of Christ.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, whose blessed Son was anointed by the Holy Spirit to be the Savior and servant of all, we pray that you to bless these oils, that those who are here anointed be made whole and may share in the royal priesthood of Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, forever and ever. **Amen.**

Remembrance of Baptism

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. The power of sin is put to death in the holy flood, and we are raised with Jesus Christ to new life. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and sent out in mission for the life of the world.

On this night God's people keep vigil, awaiting the glorious resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Through the mystery of this night, we were buried with Christ and lay dead in order that as Christ was raised, so we should also set our feet on the new path of life.

When we were joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we were clothed with God's mercy and forgiveness.

Together let us remember and affirm our baptism.

I ask you to reject sin, profess your faith in Christ, and confess the faith of the church, the faith in which be baptize.

Do you renounce the devil, and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? I renounce them.

During the profession of faith, water from the font is sprinkled on the baptized as a remembrance of baptism.

With the whole church, let us confess our faith.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord. Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

You have made public profession of your faith.

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

People of God, do you promise to support and pray for one another in your life in Christ?

We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

Hear now the description the apostle Paul gives concerning how, on this night, we are united with Christ and the forces of darkness will no longer have power over us.


Let us pray.


We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.






